




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Total Enrollment



Percent Change Over Prior Year






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Residency Status





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


Developmental Course Enrollment

First-Generation Status






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ACT Scores




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SAT Scores





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First-Semester Hours Attempted to Hours Completed Comparison



First-Semester GPA






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Persistence & Progression Rate All First-time Full-Time Freshmen
