Fredric A. Navarre is an Educator, Marketing Executive, Entrepreneur, and Philanthropist who resides in Houston, Texas.

In addition, his service in the Greater Houston area has included serving as Board Treasurer for Asians Against Domestic Abuse. In October 2019 and 2020, he was a Texas Ambassador for "Real Men Wear Pink", joining the ranks of exclusive distinguished male community leaders raising over \$6.5 million dollars for the American Cancer Society's breast cancer initiatives.
