On Tuesday, September 21, 2021, at approximately 7:23 PM, Houston Police along with TSU DPS responded to the 2900 Block of Blodgett Street in reference to shooting. Upon arrival, Officers found the victim lying on the ground with the suspect standing nearby. The suspect was taken into custody and Officers rendered aid to the victim who was unfortunately later pronounced dead at the scene.

No TSU affiliates were involved in the dispute that lead to the shooting or the shooting.

Tips On You Remaining Vigilant:

- **Be alert and aware of your surroundings at all times.** Factors that decrease your ability to be alert and aware are drugs and alcohol, fatigue, and distraction (think cell phone, etc.). Also, make sure you always know your location so if you had to call for help, you could tell the police where you are.
- **Plan ahead.** Make arrangements to get to and from your destination safely.
- **Trust your instincts.** If you see someone you think may be up to no good, take action. Make eye contact with them so they know you saw them. Move to the other side of the street or turn around. Get to a safe, well-lit location. If you think they might be following you or waiting for you, call the police.
- **Don't be afraid to report suspicious activity.** Even if the person does not approach you, if you believe they are suspicious, report it to the police. You may prevent someone else from being a victim
- **Call the police IMMEDIATELY.** Try to give the police a good description of the person, a vehicle if there is a vehicle involved, and direction of travel. Tell them about clothing; gender; race; hair length, color and style; scars, marks or tattoos; facial hair, etc.
